4	Is the population over 19,500 according to the latest census bureau (311.090, RSMo), or has it ever been?	Business qualifies for a RBD (Retail by Drink) license.	Continue to 5
5	Has the city held a ballot election to vote in liquor by the drink (311.110, RSMo)?	Business qualifies for a RBD (Retail by Drink) license. <i>If this is the first RBD issued for the city/town, a certified copy of the ballot election results is required to be submitted with the application packet.</i>	Business must qualify as a resort (311.095, RSMo). Continue to 6
6	Does business qualify as a resort or seasonal resort (311.095, RSMo)?	See 6a, 6b, 6c, 6d or 6e for qualification standards.	Business does NOT qualify for full liquor by drink. <i>Options are beer only (package or by the drink), beer and wine by the drink, or original package.</i>
6a	A resort having at least 30 rooms for overnight accommodation and having a restaurant or similar facility on the premises, of which at least 60% of the gross income is derived from the sale of prepared meals or food.	Business qualifies for a RBDR (Retail by Drink Resort) license. <i>Attach the Verification of Food & Alcohol Sale, Schedule of Gross Receipts form to the application.</i>	Continue to 6b
6b	A restaurant, without lodging,	Business qualifies for a RBDR (Retail by Drink Resort) license.	Continue to 6c

	where food is habitually furnished, and which the establishment's annual gross receipts immediately preceding the application for the license was at least \$75,000 per year with at least \$50,000 gross receipts from non-alcohol.	<i>Attach the Verification of Food & Alcohol Sale, Schedule of Gross Receipts form to the application.</i>	
6c	A new resort (6a) or restaurant (6b) establishment having been in operation for less than 90 days.	Business qualifies for a RBDT (Retail by Drink Resort Temporary). <i>Attach a Certification for Temporary Resort form to the application. Also, see 7 for additional requirements.</i>	Continue to 6d
6d	A seasonal resort restaurant which is not a new restaurant establishment which is open for business eight or fewer consecutive months in any calendar year with 50% of all gross sales from prepared meals.	Business qualifies for a RDSR (Retail by Drink Seasonal Resort). <i>Attach a Certification for Seasonal Resort form and Seasonal Verification of Food & Alcohol Sale/Schedule of Gross Receipts form to the application.</i>	Continue to 6e
6e	A new seasonal resort restaurant establishment having been in operation for less than 12 weeks.	Business qualifies for a RDST (Retail by Drink Seasonal Resort Temporary). <i>Attach a Certification for Temporary Seasonal Resort form to the application. Also, see 8 for additional requirements.</i>	Business does not qualify for full liquor by drink. <i>Options are beer only (package or by the drink), beer and wine by the drink, or original package.</i>

7	Requirements for Upgrading from a 90-Day Temporary Resort	<u>Resort</u> - Have at least 30 rooms for overnight accommodation and a restaurant on the premises, of which at least 60% of the gross income is derived from the sale of prepared meals or food.	<u>Restaurant</u> - Gross receipts during the 90-day licensing period totaling at least \$18,750 gross with at least \$12,500 from non-alcohol.	<i>Failure to meet upgrade requirements requires downgrading to another license type, or discontinuing liquor sales.</i>
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8	Requirement for Upgrading from a 90-Day Temporary Seasonal Resort	Showing a projection for annualized gross sales of which 50% shall be from prepared meals.	<i>Failure to meet upgrade requirements requires downgrading to another license type, or discontinuing liquor sales.</i>
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
